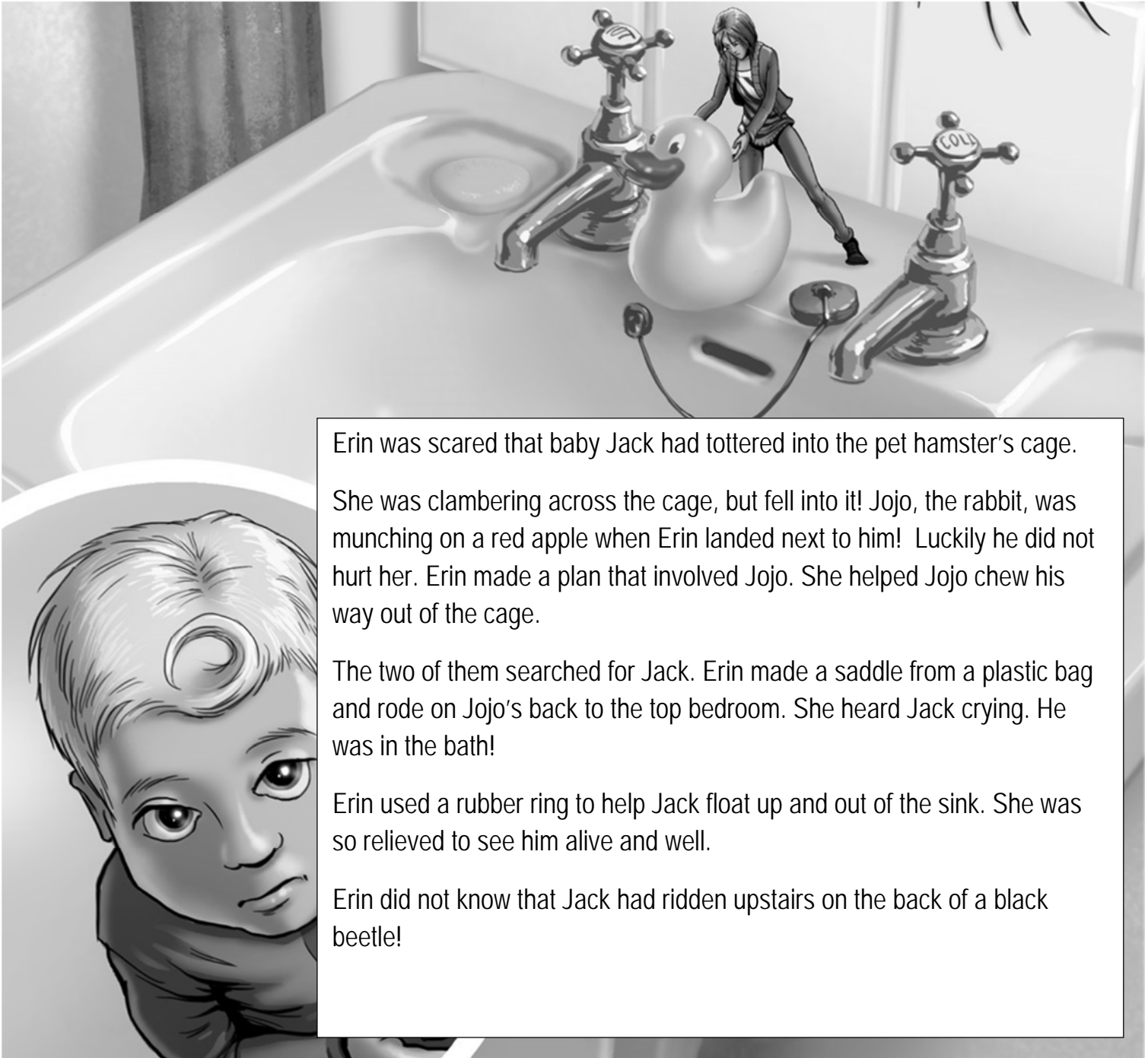

Erin did not know that Jack had ridden upstairs on the back of a black beetle!

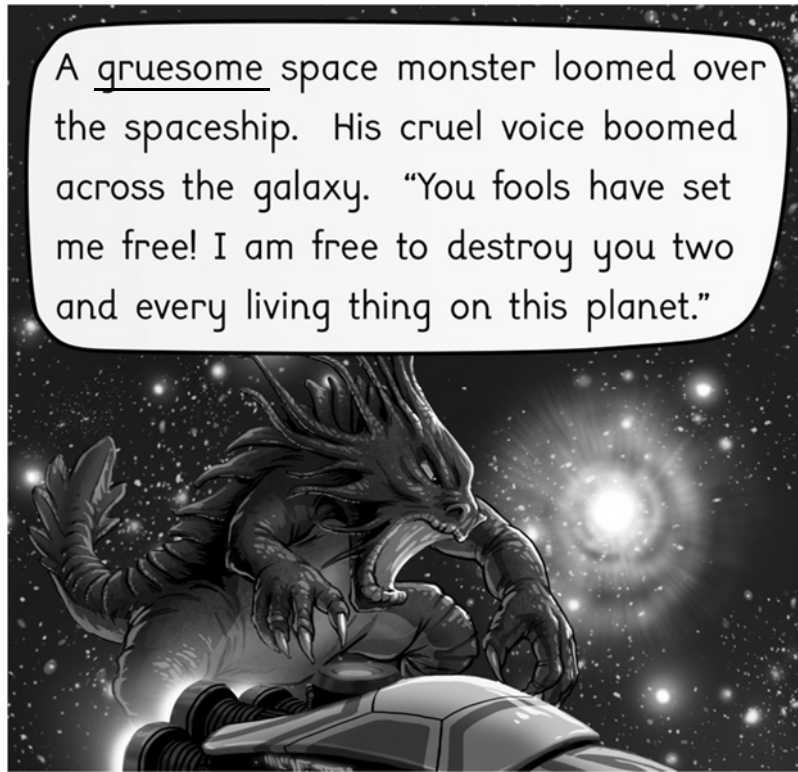
There are 7 things in the story above that are not true.
